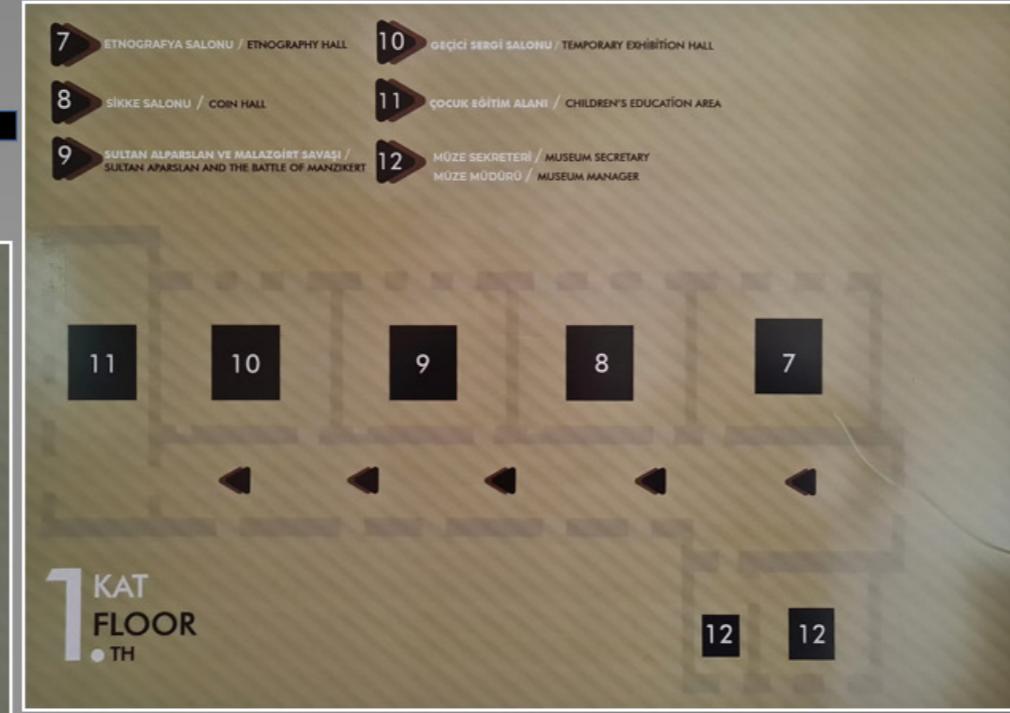


Muş Müzesi Zemin Kat Planı

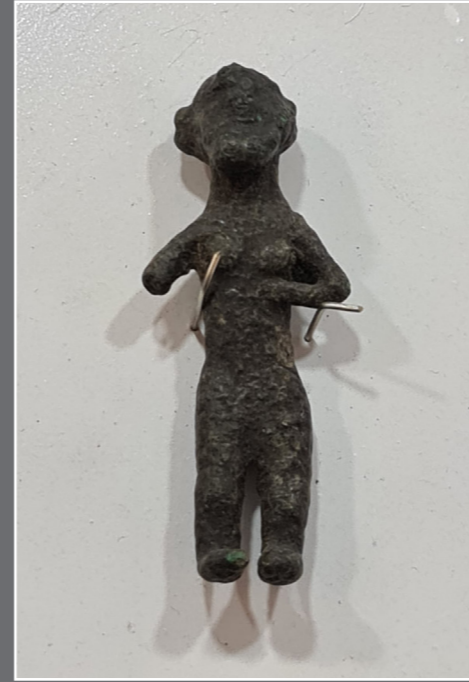
MUS MUSEUM

THE ANCIENT CITY WHERE THE
COURSE OF HISTORY CHANGED



Muş Museum was opened in 2021 with the transformation of the Atatürk Primary School building, the construction of which started in 1937 and was completed in 1938, into a Museum. In the museum; Artifacts from the Bronze Age, Iron Age, Roman, Hellenistic, Seljuk and Ottoman periods, obtained through excavation, purchase, confiscation and donation, are exhibited.

The museum includes archaeological exhibition halls, ethnographic exhibition hall, Sultan Alparslan and Manzikert War Hall and Children's Education area.



In Archaeological Halls; Starting from the Chalcolithic Age, works belonging to the Early Bronze Age, Middle Bronze Age, Late Bronze/Early Iron Age, Middle Iron Age (Urartu), Hellenistic, Roman, Eastern Roman, Seljuk and Ottoman Periods are exhibited.

In the Ethnographic Hall, necklaces, belts, belt buckles, bracelets, caps, healing bowls, vases, candlesticks, samovars, mouthpieces, coffee grinders, swords, wedges, gunpowder jars and pistols belonging to the Ottoman period are exhibited.

In the Sultan Alparslan-Malazgirt (Manzikert) War Hall, there are information about Sultan Alparslan, visuals and information panels describing the Battle of Malazgirt (Manzikert). In a short time, the artifacts obtained as a result of the surface research and drilling carried out within the scope of the Identification, Historical and Archaeological Survey of the Malazgirt (Manzikert) Battlefield Project will also be exhibited.

"Terracotta Sculptures, Votive Slabs, Tombstones and Stone Deeds" exhibited in the Archeology Hall of our museum offer visitors the opportunity to go on a historical journey about the culture, art, lifestyle and belief system of the period to which they belong. These "unique" works, which arouse a sense of curiosity and excitement in visitors, emphasize unique position of Muş in the Anatolian history scene and its differentiating aspects from neighboring provinces.
