# MİLAS STONE ARTEFACTS MUSEUM

CONVERSION TO A MUSEUM OF MADRASA OF AHMET GAZİ, SULTAN OF COASTS



Ahmet Gazi Madrasa , built in 1375, which is located within Beçin Fortress Archaeological Site under the responsibility of Milas Museum Directorate, and which is the only structure whose inscription still exists in Beçin, has been put back into use by restoration and now serves as Milas Stone Artifacts Museum. The museum consists of 9 rooms, 2 corridors and 1 courtyard. 35 stone artifacts are exhibited in the museum. The stone artefacts on display are arranged chronologically by dividing them into the period of principalities and Ottoman Period. Apart from the stone artefacts, ethnographic artefacts related to education and burial traditions are also exhibited in the museum, which is a madrasa building.



In addition to the display of artefacts, a cinevision room, miniatures of Anatolian madrasa samples, animation room is included within the museum. The tomb of Ahmet Gazi, constructor of the madrasa, and a tomb of an unknown person are located in the main iwan of the one-story madrasa with an open courtyard and two iwans.
