



Staircase 2nd Floor




Ground Floor

Staircase 1st Floor


















The mansion, which was expropriated and restored by the Ministry of Culture and Tourism and used as the Ethnography Museum, was built at the end of the 18th century.



The building, whose foundation and ground floor were built with rubble stone and main floors were built with carcass-brick mixture, has three floors. There is the gallery part where Sinop and Boyabat houses are exhibited, kitchen part and village room on the ground floor of the mansion. Jewelry, swords and weaving looms used in Sinop and its region are exhibited on the first floor of the mansion. The mansion household was revived in a large hall and 4 rooms and 3 iwans symmetrically planned around it on the second floor.
